## Marijuana Action Alert SB 2636 Amended and ready for a vote - call TODAY!



SB Expands Medical Marijuana for children under 18 for ALL of the 31 disorders, not just seizures and epilepsy! The Unintended Consequences of Marijuana-infused products are death and illness.

- Marijuana is a Schedule I drug that has not undergone testing and regulation for safety, strength, or dosage. Did you know that a doctor will not prescribe marijuana or a dosage for children?
- SB 2636 would allow a parent or legal guardian to apply for a medical marijuana card for children. Minors are eligible for a Colorado medical marijuana card if TWO physicians sign off on it. SB 2636 does not have any requirements that a physician approve marijuana for children before getting a medical marijuana card.
- Colorado allows those under 18 to have only medical cannabis infused products. The
   state is now re-thinking the rules for pot-infused food after two recent deaths. During
   the Illinois debate to legalize marijuana as medicine, the sponsor said no one had ever died
   from marijuana. Now people have died after eating and/using marijuana.
- Greater access to edible marijuana leads to an increase of children admitted to hospitals.

  Many children in Colorado have been taken to the hospital after eating marijuana-infused food. A toddler in California was taken to the hospital after eating a piece of marijuana candy she found on the beach. An Illinois woman and her 1 year old son were taken to the hospital after eating cake infused with flakes of marijuana.
- There is no prescription, no recommended dosage for marijuana. As one father has stated, "There is no prescribed solution yet. Even for the kids having a lot of success, they are all on different stuff." Some parents had the marijuana they purchased for their children at dispensaries tested to make sure it did not contain pesticide, but individual testing is no longer available in Colorado.
- Experts say the amount of marijuana in edibles can vary widely, and in some cases, the levels are so high people report extreme paranoia and anxiety bordering on psychotic behavior, reported USA Today.

Lawmakers in Colorado will spend \$10 million to study the effects of marijuana use and will
lower the amount of marijuana-infused oil or butter that can be sold. The infused oils and
butter contain concentrated marijuana levels far higher than contained in the plant
itself, reported USA Today.
