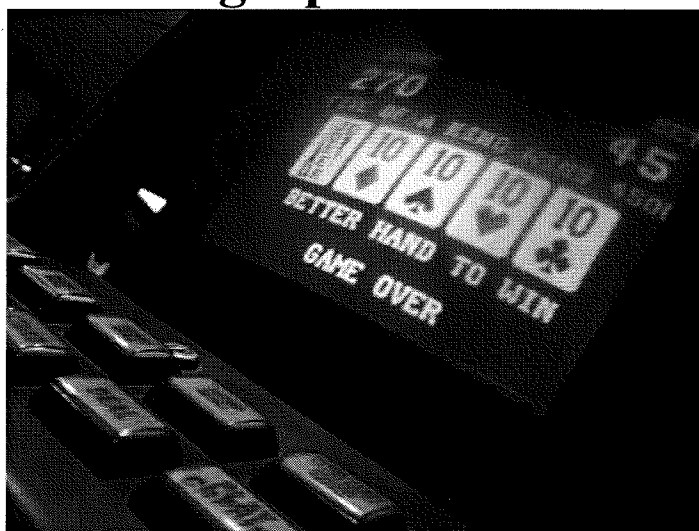

## Video Gambling Update - March 21, 2018



### Video Gambling Rejected by Voters

**Orland Park** residents said no to video gaming, answering two opposite referendum questions in Tuesday's primary. Village board members rushed to place a question on the ballot asking residents if video gaming should be approved with restrictions. Citizens opposed to gambling in Orland Park got their own question on the ballot asking if video gaming should be prohibited.

On the question of whether video gaming should be prohibited, 6,353 answered yes to the question, and 5,627 responded no, according to unofficial tallies.

On the question if video gaming should be approved, 6,159 responded no and 5,898 answered yes. Orland Park village board members said they would abide by the people's will on both questions. [Read more](#)
